Swipe Right for Reading

The Grande Prairie Public Library has released an innovative new version of it's popular library app. Called Swipe Right for Reading, not only will it search the GPPL catalogue and place holds, but it also has the power to bring library members together.

"Some of the best relationships are based on similar interests," says Hailey McCullough, Head of Adult Services. "We were brainstorming about potential new ideas for the Library and staff suggested that we could match people based on their shared reading habits."

Available only to TRACpac app users over the age of 18, the new Swipe Right for Reading app opens up the possibility for Library users to make friends, develop relationships, or create something in-between.

"Swipe Right for Reading works with an algorithm created by Library staff and will match members based on reading history and other preferences such as age and gender," says Charlotte Anderson, Emerging Technologies Librarian. "Members who have been matched will be invited to a special program later this month to meet and get to know their matches."

During the test phase, matches made through the app were promising. "It was very well received," says Rempel. "The feedback from participants showed a 92% success rate."
